Homemade Catnip Toys

I became slightly paranoid with all of the pet food scares last year. This paranoia extended to my cat's toys, too. Not knowing where half the toys I bought Ronnie came from, I decided to make my own with some organic catnip from the pet store and my fabric scraps.

- 1. Depending on how big you'd like your toy to be, cut out two identical-size squares with pinking shears. My cat is just 2 years old, so I make her toys on the smaller side so they're easy for her to toss around the floor.
- 2. Unlike making a pillow, sew the wrong sides together. Your cat won't care how nice the finished product is!
- 3. However, like a pillow, leave a small opening at the top to use as the hole for the catnip. Use a funnel and fill the square with catnip.
- 4. Sew the hole shut, toss the toy to your cat and watch her go nuts.

TIP: Use a heavier-weight fabric for this one. The first toy I made was from plain cotton, but Ronnie loved her toy so much she licked it to death. Denim, heavy fleece or upholstery fabrics work perfectly.
