## **Record Cover Pillow**

- 1. Start with a T-shirt leftover from college, given to you by a significant other or and XXXXXL freebie you got for signing up for a credit card. Grab a record album (nothing mint, please) and set up your work space.
- 2. Position the record album over the part of the design you like. This is going to a smallish pillow. Trace around the album, and cut out the two pieces.
- 3. Pin the pieces together, with the wrong sides facing one another.
- 4. Sew the sides together, stopping a few inches from where you started. You don't want to totally sew the whole thing together- how will you get your stuffing in?!
- 5. Trim any excess fabric around the square- if you have any. Turn the square inside out.
- 6. Using the stuffing of your choice (Polyfil is a natural choice), stuff the pillow. Use the eraser end of a pencil to push the stuffing down into the corners of the pillow. Depending on how firm or squishy you want the pillow, add to your desired feel.
- 7. Once the filling is finished, fold the open ends of the stuffing hole over and pin together. You can either machine stitch the hole, but I find hand-stitching makes a nice finish. Using a blind stitch, work between the two folded sides until you've got a secure closure.
- 8. Admire your hard work! And rest your head!

\*IDEA: Save your fabric scraps for a while and use for stuffing. You'll be surprised at how well they work instead of buying stuffing from the store!
